## CONTEXT



### Global risk of pest and pathogen introductions

Global trade, climate change, and mobility are accelerating the spread of plant pests, increasing the frequency and scale of phytosanitary threats.



### Phytosanitary challenges transcend national borders

Emerging and re-emerging pests affect multiple countries simultaneously, requiring coordinated, internationally aligned research responses.



### National phytosanitary research capacities are under growing pressure

Limited resources, expanding pest risks, and rising expectations challenge the ability of individual countries to respond alone.



### Effective responses depend on international research coordination

Addressing complex, transboundary plant health risks requires shared priorities, joint planning, and coordinated investment at global level.

### 🌱 **Evidence-based support for plant health decision making**

Coordinated research delivers harmonised, high-quality evidence to support regulation, risk assessment, and sustainable plant protection strategies.

Research priorities identified for national and international calls and for the development of a Strategic Research Agenda.
