PHYTOSANITARY REQUIREMENTS FOR WHEAT GRAIN (*Triticum aestivum*) IMPORTED FROM Lithuania

A. General Requirements

The consignment of wheat grain from Lithuania must be:

1. Accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate (PC) issued by the National Plant Protection Organization (NPPO) of Lithuania.
2. Through the designated point of entry in Indonesia.
3. Notified and submitted to the plant quarantine officer at the point of entry for conducting phytosanitary inspection and/or any other phytosanitary measures.
4. In case the consignment imported into a third country, the consignment must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate for re-export, issued by the NPPO of the third country and accompanied by a copy of the PC from Lithuania.

B. Specific Requirements

1. In the country of origin

The consignment of wheat grain from Lithuania must be:

- a. originated from export facility registered by the NPPO of Lithuania.
- b. free from infestation or infection by pests of concern listed in Section C and verified through phytosanitary inspection in Lithuania.
- c. free from soil, weeds, plant debris, and other contaminants.
- d. treated with fumigation with the following treatment schedule to eliminate insect pests and information of the treatment must be stated in the treatment section of the PC:

Phosphine (PH₃)

Temperature (°C)	Dosage (gram/m ³)	Exposure time (days)
> 20	8	5
16 – 20	8	10
11 - 15	9	14

- e. accompanied by a PC document issued by NPPO of Lithuania, including the following statement in the Additional Declaration section:

*“This is to certify that this consignment complies with Indonesian Phytosanitary Requirements for the export of Wheat Grain (*Triticum aestivum* L.) from the Republic of Lithuania to the Republic of Indonesia”.*

and

"This is also to certify that this consignment is originates from registered export facility with identification code: (registered code)".

2. In Indonesia

- a. Upon arrival at the entry point, the wheat grain consignment shall be subject to plant quarantine measures and/or other border control procedures in accordance with Indonesian regulations.
- b. After release from the point of entry, the wheat grain must be transported or moved safely (without spillage) to a storage and processing facility approved by the IQA.

C. Pests of Concern

Insects

1. *Sitophilus granarius* (granary weevil)
2. *Trogoderma granarium* (khapra beetle)

Fungi

3. *Claviceps purpurea* (ergot)
4. *Fusarium sporotrichioides* (kernel rot of maize)
5. *Gibberella avenacea* (Fusarium blight)
6. *Gibberella zeae* (headblight of maize)

Bacteria

7. *Pseudomonas syringae* pv. *syringae* (bacterial eye spot)
8. *Erwinia rhapontici* (wheat pink seed)

D. Other requirements

1. The consignment of wheat grain from Lithuania must be accompanied by prior notice issued by the exporter or its representatives in Lithuania before dispatchment.
2. The consignment of wheat grain from Lithuania must comply with Indonesian food safety regulations.
